The international workshop 'Biography and Body' focuses on interdisciplinary perspectives in the research field of embodied biographies. Even though there is in the last years a "body turn" in the Social Sciences, biographical research has not paid much attention theoretically in conceptualizing the connections between the body and biographical practices. In Oral History researchers have acknowledged for some time the value of non-verbal communication and embodied performativity in the interview situation. Yet a specific focus on embodied experiences in life stories is a quite recent trend. In the workshop we will bring into dialogue different theoretical and disciplinary perspectives from Sociology, Oral History, Anthropology and Gender Studies. Furthermore, we will discuss the methodological challenges that arise from the interview seen as an embodied encounter between two subjectivities and from investigating embodied experiences by using biographical methods. A focus on the body seems particularly promising in life history research concerning migration, work, sexuality, disease, political violence, disabilities, as well as in psychosocial research.

For the workshop we invite PhD students and other scholars who are working in the research field of embodied biographies to participate.
